

Tips For Writing A Thesis

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At the beginning of the project usually, the student is expected to do a Literature Review (Chapter 2) to understand the project and find out the current issue (problem statement). The literature review is important, which will help the student to write Chapter 1 (Problem Statement, Objective and etc) and Chapter 3 (Methodology). Usually, the student is expected to write his thesis after getting the proposed results, which is Chapter 4 (Results and Discussions). Although, sometimes there are some limitations to the results. However, the decision to write the thesis may be made by the supervisor depending on the academic level of the student.

Starting Point to Write a Thesis

There are different ways and strategies to write a thesis. However, I would like to share with you my opinion as a student, thus some steps should be followed to start writing a thesis:

- Thesis outline, or in other words table of contents. The student should list out the expected table of contents for his/her thesis and discuss it with the supervisor. I recommend the student to follow the thesis template provided by the faculty.
- Merging all chapters in one file (doc). Writing all chapters in one file will help the student to keep the chapters related to each other sequentially.
- In the time to start writing a thesis, a student has already written Chapter 1, 2 and 3 previously, thus it is a logically to start writing with Chapter 4. Completing Chapter 4 will keep the student motivated to complete the thesis.
- Completing the main structure is the main target. The student should write the important things in the thesis and leave other things to the end for example formatting and proofreading.

Tips for Writing a Good Thesis

Here are some points should be considered in the thesis especially for research thesis:

- Chapter one is a great place to attract the reader and show how important is your work.
- Long paragraphs are not a good thing as it becomes difficult to understand.
- Every figure and table should be referenced in the text properly and accordingly so that the reader knows when to look at it.
- Try to always define both the strengths and weaknesses of your own work. Defining weaknesses will not harm your results. However, hiding weaknesses is not recommended.
- Most of the times, be honest to write that you are just enhancing something a little bit. Justify and clarify your modifications.
- The literature review should focus on the contribution.
- Make sure the aim is the thesis, and not the initial research project, where the project has been completed.
 If you don't know it don't write it.
- The standard test for any thesis is that a 14-year old child should, at least, be able to read it.
- Try and show that this is an important topic and that your thesis is exactly what is required.
- The same goes for each chapter, where the introduction (half a page, typically) shows what you're going to tell them, and the conclusion confirms it.
- You should know your examination team before the presentation/Viva, so provide some background which might help the examiners to understand the area.
- Do not try to increase the number of pages by writing a non relevant information. A thesis written with selfcontained papers are often the best in their presentation.

GOT Blueprint 3 Non-Rhetoric Tips

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Graduate On Time (GOT) refers to students who completed their research study within a specific time frame. According to UTeM Postgraduate Academic Regulations, a Ph.D. student needs to finish their study within 8 semesters (4 years) for full time and 12 semesters (6 years) for part-time. Whereas, a Master student was given 4 semester (2 years) for full time and 8 semester (4 years) for part-time. Students that successfully achieve GOT status will bring it throughout his/her academic career. Furthermore, GOT status will also shine up the credibility of the supervisor, faculty and university. For that, all level of administration in the university working so hard to increase the number of GOT students. Therefore, I would like to share with you my opinion on 3 non-rhetoric tips or sharing from the perspective of a research student that are hopefully can illuminate your postgraduate journey.

Tips 1: Common Sense

Common sense in academic culture differs from an ordinary common sense. It's not only how we respecting elders or supervisors, being kind, honest and humble. As a postgraduate student, a better understanding of our own research compare to a supervisor, attending beneficial workshops, expanding networking and gaining additional knowledge by our own are some of the example of common sense that we need to have in the academic world. No one focus or cares about us anymore. That's why we need our common sense to develop through our own knowledge and progress. A research Gantt Chart can be helpful to monitor our daily progress and direction for our postgraduate journey. Remember, enthusiasm can turn into exhausted if we got no direction. I created my Gantt Chart by dividing them into per weeks. Every week I set one to three targets to be achieved and done. What? Only three targets a per week? Believe me, my fellow researchers, it's from my realistic judgments.

Tips 2: Computer Literacy

Emerging of the computer era like today is a blessing. We can do our research faster and easier compared to the typewriter era. But, if we sacrifice a little bit of our money, effort, and ego to learn new things on how to optimize it, we can even do our research much faster and efficiently. For Microsoft Word users, I personally recommend you all to learn, how to optimize the functions in it especially Styles, Breaks, Ruler, Navigation Pane, References and Split functions and also focus on learning about Microsoft Word plugin especially Mendeley (References)

ence Manager) and Grammarly (Grammar checking). These can be very helpful tool for us as a researcher and an academician to be. For data analysis, here are some data analysis software that are widely used in academic research; Social sciences – Quantitative data: IBM SPSS Statistics, AMOS and SmartPLS. Qualitative data: NVivo and ATLAS.ti. Engineering perspective- JMP and MATLAB. Attending seminars or workshops held by the expert are possibly the best way to learn all of this stuff. Sure, it'll cost you. If somehow you had a financial issue, just go learn it from YouTube, Google or throw away your introvert personality and learn them from your seniors.

Tips 3: Academic Database

There are tonnes of resources webpages you can found on the internet. But, not all of them are considered as quality resources in the academic world. Search your research resources from well-known or prestigious academic publishers e.g. Elsevier, Thomson Reuters, Springer, Emerald, Wiley-Blackwell, Taylor & Francis, Routledge, Sage and McGraw Hill. Most of the academic papers and books published on these publishers had been peer-reviewed and indexed by ISI Web of Science and/or Scopus, two prestigious indexing databases. In the academic world, these factors indicated the quality of that papers and books. Lucky for us, UTeM Librarians set up one-stop center called "online database" with a subscription of prestigious academic publisher's database i.e. ScienceDirect (Elsevier), Scopus (Elsevier) and Emerald Insight (Emerald).

Scopus Discontinued Titles Based On Content Evaluation

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Indexation of a journal is contemplate a cogitation of its value. Indexed journals are scrutinized to be of excessive scientific value as differentiate to non-indexed journals. Over the years, various accessible indexation system have thrive. These comprise PubMed, EMBASE, MedLine, SCOPUS, SCIRUS and EBSCO Publishing's Electronic Databases. There ensue varied national and regional category of Index Medicus such as African Index Medicus.

Our University focus on SCOPUS indexing journals. Scopus is a bibliographic database stifle citations and abstracts for academic journal articles that are peer-reviewed journals in the technical, social sciences, medical and scientific. Its vital function is to index and hound academic journals of varied content and to documentation citation from one or another source. Yet in todays dilemma, publication malpractice is an unsuitable phenomenon in the world of scholarly literature. These journals may possess a Scopus logo on their website, this does not signify they are indexed in Scopus. As an author, researcher, academician and student, who are eager to publishing research articles, if you would like to perceive if your published article will be cover in Scopus, I impulse you to yield few tips that I indicate before presenting your article to a journal or conferences.

Research Intelligence Towards Scopus Indexing.

1. Scrutinize the journal title.

Perusal the sources on Scopus database by scrutinizing the journal title and analyse the journal with citescore and metrics.

2. Exploration in Scopus database.

Utilize the Scopus search engine in the database for the designation of the journal or conference and scrutinize if any present content is accessible to identify if the title is actually indexed.

3. Email to Scopus Helpdesk.

When in confusion, communicate through an email to the Scopus Helpdesk and their customer service representative will assists and let you recognize if that title is indexed (or is progress to ensue indexed).

4. Assimilation Reason for discontinuation Scopus Indexing.

A. Publication Concerns.

Identify to Scopus by the research group and are taken seriously towards "rapid publication" on the journal title or the publisher.

B. Metrics.

Scopus evaluate the achievement of all journals in the database by converge "six (6) metrics and benchmarks" as below:

| Metric | Benchmark not achieved when | Justification |
|---|-----------------------------------|--|
| 1. Self-citation rate | ≥ 200% | Has a self-citation rate two times higher or more. |
| 2. Total Citation rate | ≤ 50% | Received half the number of citations or less . |
| 3. Cite Score | ≤ 50% | Has a Cite Score half or less than the average Cite Score. |
| 4. Number of articles | ≤ 50% | Produced half, or less the number of articles. |
| 5. Number of full-text clicks on Scopus | ≤ 50% | Full texts are used half as much, or less. |
| 6. Abstract usage on Scopus | ≤ 50% | Abstract are used half as much, or less. |

C. Radar.

Radar tool is a data analytics algorithm inculcate to discover outlier journal behaviour "comprise quick and unexplainable changes to quantity of articles published or unexplainable changes in geographical diversity of authors or affiliations" in the Scopus database.

Tips On How To Write & Publish Articles

What is the articles? I would like to share my perspective that the article is a writing idea of the concept, research finding or anything that an individual intends to share with the community. Basically, the authors or writers read lots of literature to obtain the idea to ensure their works correctly based on facts and figures. Therefore, I would like to share few tips on how I wrote an article according to my writing experience that I encounter during my research studies.

1. Follow the pattern of the articles.

Most of the beginners want to write like a "Shakespeare" but be yourself because you are not taking English literature courses. Before you start writing, please aims for the suitable type of journal that you intend to publish your work. Study the patterns of the journals. Understand the flow of the journals. Please read the their authors guidelines first, some important critical issues are stated in that section. You may also adopt the words that are suitable for your work itself. For example conjunction words and general statement that gives "boom" to the articles.

2. Writing style problems.

Most of this problem occurs in the section focusing on grammar mistakes. How to reduce? Actually, you have a lot of technological tools nowadays, that can help you in correcting your writing style. I would like to share few types of tools that can assist and help you in such situation:

A. To find similarity words.

3. Creating your networking.

A good article can be developed from your good fundamental networking. This fundamental networking will assists you on how to penetrate high impact journals in Scopus index. Some publishers are very peculiar and contemplate who are your co-authors. If your co-authors are well known and already listed in publishing high impact journals in Scopus index, then it is possibly that your article will be accepted in the particular journal.

4. Education is an investment.

At the starting point, we will try not to pay any cost for our publication, looking for "free journals". But please remember, that education is a good investment. Why did I say this? From my tips in no. 2-Writing style problems, it is possible that we can avoid any cost using technological tools. Yet, based on my experience, I ensure that my English structure should be readable and understandable, for the editors and reviewers to read it. So how do I do it? Very simple, I utilized the proofread services.

5. Be honest with yourself.

Write your article with your true hearts. Please do not copy other works and claim it yourself. I have experienced critical comments and better suggestion from the reviewers and editors regarding my article, which molded based on my own ideas. But at that time, I have felt dis-motivated and begin to learn and improve my knowledge. From my hard work and honesty, my article have been accepted from the reviewer, who is an expert in that particular field.

In the nutshell, to write an article doesn't need a superb supervisor or wait until you think you are ready to write. Just write and let it be simplify to people about your intention and your research.
